DRUG INFORMATION FELLOWSHIP

The Drug Information Fellowship position at Touro College of Pharmacy in New York is a 12-month program designed to prepare the pharmacy professional who is interested in a career in drug information/medical information. The drug information fellow will mainly be located at an academic drug information center. Throughout the program, the fellow will develop advanced skills in medical/drug information practice as a drug information specialist in various practice settings. The program also includes opportunities to gain experiences in pharmacy education/academia through teaching and precepting experiences at the College. The fellow will have the option to obtain a teaching certificate.

Job Responsibilities:

- Work with fellowship director
- Manage the drug information center operations
- Provide drug information service to internal and external health care professionals
- Teach didactic lectures
- Assist/precept pharmacy students on APPE rotation
- Complete a research project related to practice of drug information
- Poster presentation at national pharmacy conference(s)
- Publication of the research findings
- Participate in continuing education programs and community health events
- The fellow will also have the opportunity to participate in the College's committees and a teaching certificate program, based on interest

CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an ACPE-accredited College of Pharmacy
- Licensure or eligibility for licensure to practice pharmacy in the State of New York
- Individuals who have completed a PGY-1 pharmacy residency or a PGY-2 specialty residency and are interested in pursuing a career in drug information/medical information are highly encouraged to apply
- Applicants without a PGY-1 residency will be interviewed based on their academic performance/experience
