

We are currently accepting applications for the following positions for 2022-2024:



Clinical Development Fellowship



FELLOWSHIP CURRICULUM

The Medical Affairs Fellowship program is designed to provide **hands-on experience** generating and delivering scientifically accurate and clinically relevant information on TG Therapeutics' products to healthcare professionals, patients and caregivers. Fellows will gain experience in both **oncology and autoimmune disease therapeutic areas**. Fellows will spend one year in **Medical Strategy & Communications**, and the other year in **Medical Information & Operations**. Under the mentorship of the Fellowship Director and preceptors, the fellow will have the opportunity to undertake key responsibilities within Medical Affairs, including (but not limited to):



Fellows will work primarily in **Medical Strategy** and **Medical Information**. The fellow will also gain broader experience within Medical Affairs in areas such as **Field Medical (MSL), Medical Operations, Patient Advocacy, and Publication Planning**. 


FELLOWSHIP CURRICULUM



- Good communication skills (oral, written and presentation)
- Goal-oriented, high integrity, self-starter, and strong work ethic
- Ability to prioritize and multitask
- Track record of teamwork, innovation, and project management
- Legal U.S. employment eligibility - TG Therapeutics will not be sponsoring applicants for work visas at this time
- Ability to relocate to the NY Metro Area (remote work may be permitted pending COVID-19 restrictions)

- **Application Packet:** CV, Letter of Intent, Unofficial Transcript, Reference Names and Contact Information (3); samples of work (presentations, publications strongly recommended)

- Interviews will be conducted on a rolling basis, starting September 29. Candidates selected for final round interviews may be required to present a brief medical presentation during their final interview
