

PHARMACY RESIDENCY

Pharmacy Research Committee

The purpose of the Pharmacy Research Committee (PRC) is to facilitate completion of the major research projects by our pharmacy residents throughout the year.

- Residents find tremendous value in the research infrastructure we have in place.
- Residents are also supported by the primary project preceptors and program directors throughout the research process.

Components of the program include:

- A large pharmacy research committee to review and provide comments and suggestions on all research documents and presentations.
- A project list that is reviewed and optimized prior to the start of residency.
- An exciting didactic series including sessions for writing a protocol, research design, using Excel, building a database in REDCap, submitting to the IRB, and statistical analysis.
- A comprehensive, stepwise approach to successfully take the research question from concept to completion.
- A departmental protocol review meeting, during which the residents present the project to a panel of clinicians for discussion.
- Tips/tricks for submission to the Institutional Review Board.
- An internal pharmacy informatics team to expertly extract electronic data from the electronic record.
- A didactic session devoted to manuscript development and preparation.
- Presentation at local, regional, and national meetings.
