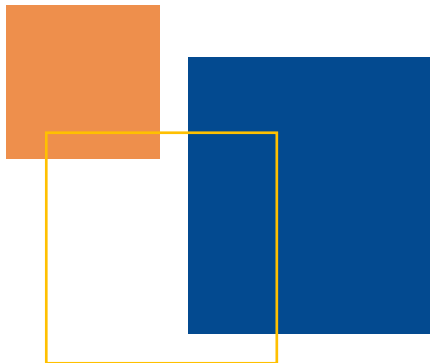


## Healthcare Quality, Medication Safety, and Population Health Fellowship

### Overview

The goal of this program is to prepare pharmacists for a career in healthcare quality improvement, medication safety, and population health by providing the opportunity to gain important skills and knowledge in this area. Within the program, the fellow will focus on medication safety, quality, pharmacy regulation and quality improvement.



### Program Dates

This fellowship is two years in length. For current start date, please contact the director of the program.

### Number of Fellows

Two concurrent fellows, with one new fellow each year.

### Training Site

The fellow will work for UF Health Physicians outpatient practices as well as the UF College of Pharmacy in Gainesville, FL, USA.

### Application Requirements

Minimum Requirements:

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an ACPE-accredited institution
- Florida Pharmacist license in good standing; or eligibility for such licensure
