



PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program

The University of Kansas Health System offers 6 positions in a 13-month post-PharmD training program. The PGY1 pharmacy residency is defined as an organized, directed, postgraduate training program that centers on development of the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed to pursue rational drug therapy.

The PGY1 pharmacy residency program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

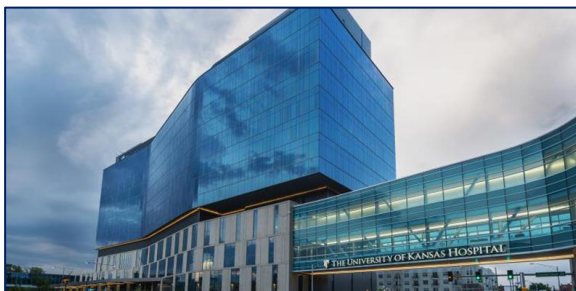

Advanced Independent Practice Learning Experience

PGY1 pharmacy residents will participate in a 6-week AIP Learning Experience. The resident will complete 4 weeks of learning experience with a preceptor and then for 2 weeks, the resident will practice independently as the clinical pharmacist for that service.

Additional Program Requirements

Research Projects

Reversed research model allows residents to work on 2 major research projects. 1 project in the first half of the residency year that was started by a previous PGY1 resident. In the second half of the year the resident initiates a research project that will be completed in the following residency year.

Formal Presentations

- Grand Rounds: 45 minute presentation in first half of the year
- CE Grand Rounds: 60 minute presentation in second half of the year with CE credit
- Leadership Journal or Book Club Discussion: 30 minute facilitate discussion
